Elkhorn Area School District Referenda

QUESTION NUMBER I

Shall the Elkhorn Area School District, Walworth County, Wisconsin be authorized to issue pursuant to Chapter 67 of the Wisconsin Statutes, general obligation bonds in an amount not to exceed \$22,900,000 for the public purpose of paying the cost of a school building and improvement program consisting of: acquisition of approximately 56 acres of land located east of the high school and west of Highway 12 for site improvements and the creation of and improvements to outdoor athletic facilities for school and community use; related site improvements at the high school and middle school including the construction of new agricultural greenhouse facilities, remodeling and renovation of the auditorium, academic and gymnasium spaces and construction of a new multi-use athletic center; renovation of unfinished areas of the 1887 building; and acquisition of furnishings, fixtures and equipment?

Shall the Joint School District Number 4, Towns of Geneva and Linn, Walworth County, Wisconsin be authorized to issue pursuant to Chapter 67 of the Wisconsin Statutes, general obligation bonds in an amount not to exceed \$4,600,000 for the public purpose of paying the cost of a school improvement project consisting of constructing additions to and remodeling and renovations at the District building, including a gymnasium, classrooms and learning space, safety and security improvements, kitchen/cafeteria improvements and HVAC upgrades; site improvements; and acquisition of related equipment, furnishings and fixtures?

Whitewater Unified School District Referendum

Shall the Whitewater Unified School District, Jefferson, Rock and Walworth Counties, Wisconsin be authorized to issue pursuant to Chapter 67 of the Wisconsin Statutes, general obligation bonds in an amount not to exceed \$23,500,000 for the public purpose of paying the cost of a school building and improvement project consisting of district-wide building renovation and remodeling of instructional spaces, safety improvements including secured school entrances, and ADA compliance updates; construction of a new gymnasium/multipurpose room and instructional spaces at Lincoln Elementary (LINCS) and expanded physical education facility at the high school; and district-wide building infrastructure upgrades including related furnishings and fixtures, and site improvements?
