To Prepare: Locate all medications in your household and ensure that they are securely stored (all lids are tightly secured on all bottles away from the reach of children and pets).

Identify which are unwanted and/or have expired dates. Empty pills into a re-sealable plastic bag. Remove the labels and recycle your pill bottles at home. Liquids, creams, gels, etc. can remain in their original containers, removing any labels if you wish to remain anonymous, then place into a re-sealable plastic bag to prevent leaking.

Sharps/Needles: Free disposal at Aurora Pharmacy locations. Must be in Sharps container. Containers not accepted if over-filled or broken.
