WHO WE SERVE

We opened as a food pantry on May 2nd, 2009 and presently serve more than 1300 people each month in the area with food assistance. We also serve 7 other food pantries in Walworth County.

- Able to Verify income within program guidelines

FOOD SOURCES

The food we distribute is purchased at regular and reduced prices from local retailers, private food distributors, Hunger Task Force, FEEDING AMERICA and the USDA, TEFAP and TMP Programs.

The Emergency Food Assistance Program (TEFAP) and Trade Mitigated Products (TMP)

What is it?

TEFAP is a federal program that provides food commodities to distribution sites like the food pantry. The food received represents about 10% of the total food we distribute. The rest comes from private sources.

Who is eligible?

Wisconsin households are eligible to receive commodities at participating food pantries if the total gross income for the household does not exceed 185% of the federal poverty level. Eligibility is based on current income status and self-declared eligibility for participation.

**Senior Stock Box and
Senior Assistance Mission
(S.A.M.)**

What is it?

StockBox is a free box of healthy food that includes cereal, milk, canned veggies and fruits, pasta or rice, protein, fruit juice, canned meats and 2 lbs of fresh Wisconsin cheese. This box is offered in addition to the regular amount of food distributed by the pantry each month. **S.A.M.** is a newly developed program to provide a bag of basic toiletries each month.

Who is eligible?

People age 60+ who live in Wisconsin and have a monthly income of \$1,354 or less (or \$1,832 for a two-person household).
